

Wage Subsidy Assistance

Early this year in January 2020, a new café opened up in Arutanga, Aitutaki. It is called Mouarii Café, named after Tereapii Nolan who is a returning Cook Islander from Australia. While in Australia, she visits all kinds of cafés and restaurants ordering delicious food in Brisbane. She loved the café scene and

enjoyed it so much that she decided to have her own café in the heart of Aitutaki. Tereapii has adjusted to the challenges of Covid-19 which meant reducing the café's hours and opening during certain days of the week. The Wage Subsidy has helped the café. "Thank you MFEM for keeping us afloat" says Tereapii. Without the subsidy, they would not have been able to stay open.

Mouarii Café opens for breakfast from 7am to 11pm then lunch from 12pm to 4pm.

The Café did open for dinner however, if you have a group of more than 6 people, Tereapii will open the café for your group. They have been holding quite a few

functions and has the capacity to cater up to 50 people. She has something lined up for Melbourne Cup Day – Champagne breakfast and other events to encourage more customers. Even better, she has organized an island string band on Saturday nights for great entertainment. There's also Pension Week BBQ happening every two weeks.

Agriculture Technology

In an attempt to diversify our economy, Government is looking at Agriculture as one of the sectors to grow and develop. The focus is to increase the use of technology to improve production and efficiency. This may mean a departure from the traditional methods and mindsets to a more technology based method. Agritech is short for Agriculture Technology. SMART Agritech Scheme is the vehicle in which Government employed to support farmers transform agriculture.

This support comes in the form of grant funding and is available to Cook Islands people who have projects involving technology that increase productivity and improve the commercial viability of commercial farming.

Examples of the types of technology may include: as stated by the Agritech policy

Smart irrigation systems — more efficient automated irrigation systems that utilize technology to track weather conditions, minimize water use and maximize crop growth.

Smart input application systems – software and technology systems that provide accurate information about the quality and type of soil, monitor crop growth to allow efficient application of fertilizers and other inputs e.g. drones that can scan with imaging sensors and create GPS maps using onboard cameras.

Smart farming systems – innovative ways to carry out farming using fewer natural (land and soil) or human resources e.g. high-tech greenhouses, hydroponic systems, application of farm robotics and other smart mechanical technology to reduce labor.

Smart crop processing – application of new technology to improve crop processing efficiency, minimizing wastage and maximizing yield, improving profitability.

Applications for this scheme opened on 1 July 2020. Farmers involved in commercial farming are encouraged to apply. There is no closing date for this scheme but funds are limited. Annual Returns—Foreign Enterprise

Registered Foreign Companies

As of 15 July, a total of 44 companies have filed their annual returns for the last Financial year, 2019. Meitaki Maata to those registered Foreign Enterprise companies for filing your annual returns.

Every company on the register, must prepare and file an annual return. Failure to file an annual return can have several consequences. Failure to comply commits an offence under the Development Investment Act 1995 – 96 and shall be liable on conviction to a fine not less than \$200 nor more than \$2000.
